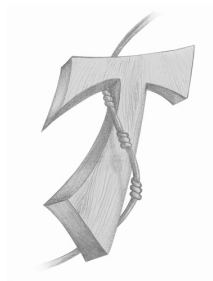

NATIONAL HYMN


1. God of our fathers, whose almighty hand




